1	Flexibility	Products that can seamlessly flex between on-campus, hybrid, and virtual programs for original credit, unit and credit recovery, learning gap remediation, on-grade skill reinforcement, and test readiness.	Products that are difficult to use remotely or hard to integrate into classroom activities, are limited in use, and don't generate data for accountability.
2	Curriculum	Robust curriculum that is built from standards, focused on need-to-know information, and includes direct instruction, practice, review, and assessment.	Apps and single-use curricula that complicate professional development, data coordination, and your technical ecosystem.
3	Support for all students	Extensive scaffolds and embedded supports based on an understanding of the literacy, language, and academic needs of middle and high school students.	Programs with one-size-fits-all, generic tools for students and limited ways for students to get in-context help.
4	Active learning	Thoughtful use of multi-media to engage students, active involvement on every page of instruction, and non-scored practice with instructive, answer-specific feedback.	Instruction delivered primarily through passive forms of media—like video—with limited opportunities for active engagement and practice.

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5	Help with teacher shortages or virtual school needs	An accredited online school that provides high-quality instructional content and certified teachers.	Programs that can't support your need for teachers when you have staff shortages.
6	Support	A dedicated professional educator who provides unlimited support throughout the life of the contract.	Support that is driven by contracted days or hours and delivered by whoever's available.
7	Reliability	99+% uptime and honoring of start date requests, even in the busiest of times.	Programs with a history of server crashes and long waits for onboarding.
8	Integrations	Zero cost integrations with your systems for SSO; data exchange; and user, program, and content management with partnerships and certifications from leading organizations.	Limited, costly, complicated integrations.
9	Efficacy	Comparison data between students who used the product and those who didn't, along with gains on meaningful measures like high-stakes tests.	Results based on system measures or growth without comparison to non-users.
