### **Background to the Packs**

This pack has been created to support your students as they look to compete in this year's PlayLive Challenge.

- Day 4 Prefixes
- Day 5 Suffixes

### What Does This Pack Include?

The worksheets, which come with answer sheets, become gradually more difficult as they progress, and include materials suitable for all primary school students.


### **Activity Idea**

### **OUTDOOR ALPHABET LETTER HUNT**

This activity is great for encouraging students to sound out spoken words and also brilliant for spelling practice.

### What You'll Need:

• Lots of leaves with lower and upper case letters written on them. (Alternatively, you could use pieces of card or other objects to write the letters on.)



### How to Play:

- So, there's a bit of preparation needed for this activity, as the leaves will need hiding around the playground or classroom, depending on your preference.
- Then, put your students in small teams and encourage them to search for the leaves you've hidden.
- Once they've gathered all of the leaves, ask them to piece the letters together to make words.

Tip! To challenge students further, you could even set them the task of finding as many words as they can in a given time.
